WHAT IS ELDER ABUSE?

A crime that is committed against older adults. It is the most pervasive and underreported crime across the nation. Anyone can be abused, but those that are unable to protect themselves due to advanced age, physical disability, or mental impairment are at higher risk.

WARNING/SIGNS OF ELDER ABUSE:

Socially isolated, confused or depressed, undernourished or dehydrated, poor hygiene, bruises or bedsores, difficulty sleeping, not receiving appropriate health care, changes in finances and legal documents.
